### **Bishop's Diocesan Tour Reflections**

- **D.** <u>hone homilies</u> to ensure that they are relevant and topical. It was requested that priests explain and apply the Scriptures clearly, rather than resorting to extra-cerebral interpretations. Practical and experiential references have more impact. A homily is not a lecture. It should, and does, give people a thought or two to take away with them, affecting both mind and heart, spirit and emotion. It should leave people wanting to do something about what they have heard, to the extent that they want to put some ideas into action themselves and tell others about it too!
- E. Some priests are still saying Mass in an old-fashioned way.

They have not even yet adapted to coming out from behind the altar. They and their presentation sometimes appear unprepared; they stumble over words; they "lose" things around the sanctuary and wander off in search of them, even to the sacristy. Others, however, are brilliant, well prepared, yet flexible, communicative, listenable to, AND humorous!, without making entertainment the only experience that people remember. A Celebrant and Readers should automatically accept they need to use a microphone. Using the sound system – tested for each individual Priest and Reader to detect the correct levels of volume, etc. - makes all the difference in clarity, hearing, ease of listening, and linking into the Loop system for those who are hard of hearing. Be aware of a church's acoustics.
