

ADVENT SUNDAY – 27th November 2022

This Sunday marks the beginning of a New year in the calendar of the Church after another momentous year in the life of the nation – the year of two Monarchs, three Prime Ministers, four Chancellors, as well as (ahead of us) the most challenging energy/cost of living crisis since the Second World War, and the very survival of many species of life on our planet, in the greatest environmental challenge to our climate since our first parents were commissioned in the Garden of Eden to “till the earth and to keep it” (Genesis 2 v 15). The Season of Advent reminds us that history has a direction and a purpose. The purpose of life, in all things, is to seek God’s glory, and the direction of history is the “Return of the King”. As the return of Christ draws closer, there will be “great tribulation, such as has not been from the beginning of the world until now, no, and never will be” (St. Matthew 24 v21) before “they will see the Son of Man coming in a cloud with power and great glory” v 27). Through the many trials and tribulations of life, Advent reminds us that we are to have our eyes fixed on Jesus so that “when these things begin to take place” says Jesus “raise your heads, because your redemption is drawing near” (v 28) May this Season of Advent be for us a time of deep reflection, of prayer and devotion as we learn to read “the signs of the times” and seek that deeper consecration to Christ and a new “advent” of the Holy Spirit. “Come, Holy Spirit!”, “Come, Lord Jesus!”.

Prayer for Ukraine (from the Bishops ’Conference) *“Mary, Our Lady of Kiev, Mother of God, We ask you to intercede for the people of Ukraine, For their government and all who suffer as a result of war. Be with them as you stood beside your Son, Suffering on the Cross at Calvary. Give them strength and courage, Through faith, hope and justice. May we, in our turn, Support them through prayer and generosity, That lives may be saved, the injured healed, that the dead may rest in peace, And that war will end in peace”.*
