PRAYER TO THE HOLY SPIRIT.

"Renew Your wonders in this our day, as by a New Pentecost. Grant to Your Church that, being of one mind and steadfast in prayer with Mary, the Mother of Jesus, and following the lead of blessed Peter, it may advance the reign of our Divine Saviour, the reign of truth and justice, the reign of love and peace. Come Holy Spirit, in Your power and might to renew the face of the earth". (Pope St.John XXIII).

"Holy Spirit, Lord of Light, from the clear celestial height, Thy pure beaming radiance give. Come, Thou Father of the poor, come with treasures that endure, Come Thou Light of all that live. Light Immortal, Light Divine, Visit Thou this soul of mine, Wash the stain of guilt away. Bend the stubborn heart and will, Melt the frozen, warm the chill, Guide the steps that go astray" Come, Holy Spirit!

The Season of Lent

"Grant, O Lord, that we may begin with holy fasting this campaign of Christian service, so that, as we take up battle against spiritual evils, we may be armed with weapons of self-restraint. Through our Lord Jesus Christ, Your Son, Who lives and reigns with You in the unity of the Holy Spirit, God for ever and ever. Amen"

On Wednesday we enter into the Season of Lent through the door of Ash Wednesday – a time to bring ourselves into the presence of God with a profound sense of our need of forgiveness ("that I have greatly sinned, in my thoughts and in my words, in what I have done and in what I have failed to do, through my fault, through my fault, through my most grievous thought") but also to pray for grace, that through our acts of penitence and self-denial we may bring down upon us and our families showers of blessing and of grace and a time of renewal and refreshment in the life of the Church. On **Ash Wednesday** we shall receive upon the crown of our heads a sprinkling of ashes to symbolise our repentance "in dust and ashes" as we recognise our frailty and mortality ("remember thou art dust, and unto dust shalt thou return") and think of ways, during the forty days of Lent, to express our contrition through acts of self-denial and/or extra acts of charity and almsgiving.

<u>Stations of the Cross</u> – during Lent, each Friday (St. Joseph's) at 6-30 p.m. and on Saturdays (St. John Kemble) at 3-30 p.m. The opportunity to reflect more deeply upon, and to join ourselves to, the sufferings of Christ, "for by Thy Holy Cross Thou hast redeemed the world" and, perhaps, to remember and pray for the people of Ukraine that they may be given the strength to bear the Cross that has come upon them.
