#### PALM SUNDAY - 10th April 2022

#### **HOLY WEEK AND EASTER**

Through Palm Sunday we enter into Holy Week, ascending to Mount Calvary where, in the Humiliation of the Cross, the Son glorifies the Father in the most subline offering of worship ever to be offered, in surrendering Himself to the Will of the Father that He should be obedient to His witness to the Truth even unto death; that He should not seek in any way to defend Himself and that in surrendering Himself to death, as a willing and innocent victim, He would overthrow and conquer death in His Glorious Resurrection from the Dead and make that Resurrection Power forever available to us, as we surrender to Him in His surrender to the Father. May this Holy Week be for us a new consecration to the Risen Jesus as we pray that the Risen, Ascended and Glorified Jesus may pour out the Holy Spirit upon us in a New Pentecost and especially on those preparing this month for the Sacrament of Confirmation. May God grant us all a Holy and Blessed Eastertide.

N.B. Although the omicron virus seems not to be as debilitating as previous outbreaks, in view of the number within both our congregations contracting covid (some for the second time) and to respond to a general desire to proceed cautiously, we shall once again this year greatly simplify our Holy Week and Easter ceremonies so that, in seeking to accommodate larger numbers this year, everyone feels comfortable in attending. Hopefully, God willing, next year we can return to the fuller celebration of the rituals and ceremonies of Holy Week and Easter.

<u>Palm Sunday</u> Please pick up a Palm Cross as you enter - there will be a simple Blessing of the Palms, the First (Entrance) Gospel and then the first hymn. This year, as last year, the Passion Gospel will be the shorter version and not divided into parts for different voices.

<u>Holy Thursday</u> As last year, there will be no washing of feet or stripping of the Altar. After Mass the Blessed Sacrament will be reposed in the Tabernacle behind the Altar ( rather than in the Lady Chapel ) and the church will remain open until 9 o'clock for private prayer in which the Holy Father has asked that, in particular, we remember the people of Ukraine.

<u>Good Friday</u> The Passion Gospel will be the shorter version and not divided into parts for different voices. The Solemn Intercessions will include an additional petition ( from the Bishops' Conference ) for the people of Ukraine. As last year, there will be no processing to, and kissing of, the Cross but the Crucifix will be lifted up for general veneration with the words "Behold the Cross on which hung the Saviour of the World" with the response, "Come let us adore".

<u>Easter Vigil</u> As last year, there will be no Easter Fire outside the church but begin with the blessing and lighting of the Paschal Candle (in situ).

<u>UKRAINE</u> <u>Our Lady of Kiev</u> is probably the most famous Icon of Our Lady ( please see the Hymn Sheet and the Icon in front of the statue of Our Lady – you may wish to light a candle ) was made in 1132. It is a masterpiece, comparable for its beauty and psychological depths to the Mona Lisa and is the first great work in the Ukrainian School of Iconography. The Icon displays the great tenderness of Our Lady for her Divine Child. The Virgin's head touching the baby is a gesture of deep affection and the icon set the standard for Ukrainian icon painters which has never been surpassed. Providence has preserved the icon through centuries of war and ( ironically ) it was removed to Moscow in 1395.

<u>Prayer for Ukraine</u> ( from the Bishops 'Conference ) "Mary, Our Lady of Kiev, Mother of God, We ask you to intercede for the people of Ukraine, For their government and all who suffer as a result of war. May we, in our turn, Support them through prayer and generosity, That lives may be saved, the injured healed, that the dead may rest in peace, And that war will end in peace".
