THE PARISH SYNODS

Last Wednesday evening the first Parish Synod meeting took place in the Parish Hall with a number of parishioners in attendance. As, once again, the consultation process has been extended, there is now more time before our parish findings have to be submitted and therefore you have the opportunity to contribute your ideas/reflections on the following two questions which were discussed at the meeting.

- (i) What is my dream for the Church so that it can become more outward looking, more missionary, especially towards those on the margins?
- (ii) What hinders the baptised from being active in mission? How does the community support its members who serve in various ways (social and political involvement, scientific research, education, promoting social justice, protecting human rights, caring for the environment etc)?

A suggestion box is placed at the back of the church for those who wish to contribute but are unable to attend the meetings. May the Holy Spirit guide us in our understanding of what He is saying to the Church at this time.

The date of the next meeting is now re-scheduled for Wednesday 5th January at 2-00 p.m. in the Hall.

Thank you to Gregory and Angela for agreeing to act as our "parish facilitators" and making arrangements for our two parishes to join together to discuss the suggested topics/questions proposed for reflection, as a contribution to the synodical process. OCTOBER MASS ATTENDANCE – All the churches in the Diocese have experienced a significant decline in the numbers attending Mass because of the Covid Pandemic. For your interest, of the 44 parishes in the Diocese, 10 had an average attendance of over 100 (over each weekend) in October - St. Joseph's, Neath, having the fifth highest average attendance in the Diocese (115 Mass attendees – before the pandemic average attendance was just over 200). St. John Kemble, Glynneath, was 43 out of 44 (!) with an average attendance in October of 8 (before the pandemic average attendance was 16) - only Pontyberem had less – with 7. Let us continue to pray that this "pruning" of the Church will lead to vigorous new growth and Resurrection in the life of the Church.
