Neil will be available to hear confessions from 5-30 p.m. before the Saturday Vigil Mass. Please arrive in plenty of time. Confessions can be either face-to-face or use the privacy of the cubicle.

**COVID REGULATIONS** There is no longer a legal limit on the number of people who can meet in public places, including places of worship, but if it is intended to sing the guidance remains to maintain a 2m distance between individuals/bubbles. Therefore, in **St.Joseph's** we shall keep every other pew roped off so that we can sing hymns. This still allows us to accommodate 60 individuals or ( perhaps ) 70- -80 sitting also in bubbles. In **St.John Kemble** we shall remove the ropes to enable a larger number to participate in the Mass and therefore suspend the singing of hymns. It remains **obligatory to wear a mask** ( except for medical/health reasons ) and please continue to sanitize your hands. As a precaution, we shall continue to clean the pews after Mass but no longer require stewards at the door. It is no longer necessary to have separate entrances and exits or to follow the floor arrows. **MANY, MANY THANKS** to those who have enabled the celebration of Mass to continue throughout the pandemic through volunteering to steward at each Mass and to those who continue to sanitize the pews. We shall proceed cautiously and respond appropriately to any change in circumstances. We hope that some will now feel encouraged to return to Mass – perhaps beginning by attending a weekday celebration of Mass – whilst respecting the fact that some may still feel uncomfortable, at the present time, meeting indoors with a larger group of people. The pandemic is far from over and, whilst giving thanks to God that the situation has improved for us here in Britain, the virus is still spreading globally and it is still possible new variants will reach our shores in the weeks and months ( and years ) ahead. More than ever, as Christians, we are learning to take each day as it comes – to give thanks for today and not to presume upon tomorrow.

#### **PRAYER AT THE BEGINNING OF THE DAY**

Lord, as I step out into this day in all the frailties and imperfections of my nature, I do not know what this day will bring. I do not know if You will bring me to the end of this day.
